




# LET'S COMPARE...

At 8,900 square feet, East Lake Community Library is one of the smallest libraries in Pinellas County - but serves an average of 75,000 patrons annually.

This graph reflects the disparity with other north county libraries when comparing size versus service population. Note that Safety Harbor Library is also adding 4,800 square feet in 2025.


Because of limited space, ELCL's collection has remained at just over 40,000 items for TEN years! This library cannot offer a broader collection of materials to meet patrons' needs and interests in the present building.
